



The 4th JEF-KRA Global Risk Symposium

~ Global risks and opportunities under the "with-corona" global order ~

17:00 ~19:00 (JST), Monday 12 and Tuesday 13 October

Japan Economic Foundation (JEF) and Komatsu Research & Advisory (KRA) will be holding the 4th Global Risk Symposium over 2 consecutive days to analyse the current rapidly changing international climate from a multifaceted perspective. Given the pandemic, for the first time, it would be held by video conference (with simultaneous interpreters).

The symposium will be opened by Mr. Kusaka Kazumasa, Chairman and CEO of JEF, followed by our distinguished guest speaker Professor Yoriko Kawaguchi, former Foreign Minister to Japan. The two-day sessions will be moderated by Dr. Keiichiro Komatsu, Principal of Komatsu Research & Advisory.

On day 1, Sir Paul Collier, Professor of Economics and Public Policy at the Blavatnik School of Government, University of Oxford, will set the scene by explaining the interactions between globalisation and COVID-19, the radical uncertainties we are facing from the pandemic and the way in which different societies have responded. He will also explain the importance of combining tacit knowledge (including unwritten practical business experiences) with expert knowledge (including written academic expertise).

Professor Kaya, who has been building a network to preserve indigenous knowledges of Africa and beyond, will explain how the pandemic has impacted Africa and the existing inequalities, as well as Africa's resilience. He will draw on the African experience and tacit indigenous knowledge, how the continent counter to the Western image of vulnerable fragile Africa, has so far managed to limit the pandemic. The other prominent speakers will then join in the panel discussion, with questions coming from the moderator, speakers and the audience.

On day 2, Mr. Nigel Inkster CMG, former Assistant Chief and Director of Operations and Intelligence at the British SIS (also known as MI6), will cover the topical themes of China and cybersecurity from a British perspective.

He would be followed by Dr. Dong Yong-Sueng, Former member of Council of Policy Advisors to the President of the Republic of Korea, who will cover the impact of the pandemic on North Korea, the Korean peninsula and East Asia focusing on the different political regimes.

The talks will be followed by a panel discussion among all 4 speakers, taking questions from the audience.
